
## 2015 VBS Faith Trail

A book you may want to check out from our Church Library is <u>The Red Rose Crew: A True</u> <u>Story Of Women, Winning, And The Water</u> by Daniel J Boyne



In 1975, a group of amazing women rowed

their way to international success and glory, battling sexual prejudice, bureaucracy, and male domination in one of the most grueling and competitive sports around. Among the members of the first international women's crew team--and one of the first women's teams anywhere--were Gail Pearson, the soft-spoken MIT professor who fought equally hard off the water to win the political battles necessary for her team to succeed; lead rower Carie Graves, a statuesque bohemian from rural Wisconsin who dropped out of college and later became the most intense rower of the crew; and Lynn Stillman, a tiny sixteen-year-old coxswain from California.

On hand to guide them was Harry Parker, the legendary Harvard men's crew coach who overcame his doubts about the ability of women to withstand the rigors of hard training. From their first dramatic bid at the 1975 World Championships to their preparations for their first Olympic Games in 1976, this gripping story of bravery, determination, and indomitable spirit captures a compelling moment in the history of sports and of America.

#### Legacy Giving: It's Not as Hard as You Think By Randy Johnson, Christian Church Foundation

We often read in church newsletters or worship bulletins the question "Have you remembered the church in your will?" It is a good question for our churches to be asking and for us to be answering. Your Last Will and Testament is a great way for you to express your love to family members and others important to you and to your God through a gift to the church, the region or other ministries important to you. But so often we procrastinate and don't execute our wills because writing a will intimidates us or overwhelms us.

I want to suggest to you that providing an end of life gift to loved ones and the church does not have to be difficult. In fact, you could put a gift plan in place this week without having to pay anybody to help you.

Do you have a life insurance policy? If so, changing your beneficiary designation is easy and it is free. Why not include a charitable gift of 10 or 20 percent or possibly even a child's share to the ministries important to you? Simply call your insurance agent and request a new "Beneficiary Designation" form. Fill it out with the changes you would like to make and return it to your insurance carrier. It is that simple.

These days many of us contribute to retirement accounts like IRAs, 401(k)s or 403(b)s so that we will have assets and a stream of income available to us in retirement. Do you realize that the distribution of these accounts at the end of your life is not governed by your will? These assets will be distributed by "Beneficiary Designation" just as with your life insurance. If you have a retirement account, simply contact the administrator of your account(s) and request a new "Beneficiary Designation" form. Consider including a charitable gift as a percentage of the account. You could accomplish this in a day or two. It is that simple.

A will is important. It allows you to distribute other assets as you would like, and is vital if you want to appoint guardians for any minor children. But if you want to put a gift plan in place, do it quickly at no cost and have the ability to change it in the future, the beneficiary designation on retirement accounts and life insurance policies is a valuable option available to you.
