Thank you for supporting the mission of Bon Air Christian Church with your gifts of Time, Talent, and Treasure. If you have not turned in your Estimate of Giving/ Pledge Card or Time and Talent Questionnaire, you can still mail it to the church, place it in the offering plate, or email Suzanne and Duke Dale at smsw1@verizon.net. Your annual gifts are confidential and known only by Suzanne and Duke, our Financial Secretary. They also provide you with your annual report of giving for income tax purposes.

Online Banking- Several members are now using "bill pay" from their online banking account to make contributions. Insert the church name, address and amount; just as you would a vendor.

IRA -If you are retired and have an IRA you are eligible make a tax free distribution directly from your IRA trustee to the church. Please discuss this in detail with your trustee to insure it is applicable to your account.

Stock-The dollar value of a gift of stock to the church is calculated at the time of the gift. An example would be

if you purchased, inherited, or were given stock with a value of \$10 per share and it is currently worth \$40 per share; your tax deduction is the full \$40 per share. Neither you nor the church pays income tax on the \$30 per share appreciation in value. A gift of stock prior to December 31st will be an income tax deduction for 2016. MALAWI

Last year BACC contributed school supplies and monetary donations to support the University of North Carolina at Willmington's -aoina work with schools in Malawi. Malawi is located in southeastern African and is one of the smallest countries in Africa. It is one of the poorest countries in the world and was hit hard in the AIDS epidemic. The Malawian public school system was recently developed (1994) and remains the best avenue to prevent the spread of AIDS to future generations.


A former British colony, Malawi is now an independent republic with a democratic government. It is very rural and its economy is largely agriculturally based. Floods in 2015 and droughts in 2016 ruined crops for two consecutive years, leading to hunger across the country. Nearby Zimbabwe declared a state of emergency resulting from the devastating effects of recent weather events on crops.

School is free for elementary-age children, the upper grades are only available to those that can pay for it. UNC-W has a long standing relationship with the Malawi education system. They help provide school supplies and support for cur-

riculum materials and desks. Each summer a team of students and professors travels to Malawi to provide hands on assistance to local educators.

In the summer of 2017 Claire will be on the team traveling to Malawi.

Sitina, Abdi and Ahmed are settled into their apartment at Sunrise Apartments. They have met some of their neighbors and have enjoyed making the apartment "home" by putting up curtains and pictures.

Abdi and Ahmed are enrolled at James River High School. They are getting used to their new classes and some adjustments are being made to their schedules to ensure their classes are a good fit. They have the benefit of tutoring from several BACC folks including Ann Thomas, Rick Novak, Cecelia Andrick, Cathy Law

and Barbara Bancroft.

Sitina is making progress in English and can follow and participate in conversations. She will begin an employment readiness class in late September or early October and the IRC employment specialist will be assisting her in a job search.

On September 12 the family hosted a dinner in honor of Eid Al-Ada - the holiest holiday in the Muslim calendar. This festival commemorates the Prophet Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his son Isaac. Sitina prepared a wonderful dinner of Ethiopian dishes for

her American friends and friends they have made from other countries.

The family continues to express their deep gratitude and love for their "church family" which is what Sitina calls us. We have certainly made a profound difference in their lives and they have transformed ours as well.
