Jesus called us to choose love in all things. He said, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Rather than returning hate for hate we are called to pray for those whose lives are filled with hate. We pray for those who are victims of discrimination. We pray for those who are lost in bitterness, anger and hate. We pray that we may build a world where others may see and know God's love, grace and mercy. Let the light of God's love shine through you. *I'm gonna let it shine, let it shine, let it shine.*
