CARITAS is Coming!

September 21st - 28th

BACC will host the CARITAS women's program from September 21st - 28th so please mark your calendars!

Many of you know that CARITAS is changing its service approach. Rather than moving clients from church to church each week a central facility is under development.

The men's program has already transitioned to a single site. The family program is in the process of transitioning this spring and summer. However, since the entire project will not be completed until sometime in 2020, congregations are still needed to host the women's program. They expect it too will transition to the new facility sometime in 2020.


We will need many hands to provide the help and support to care for 30 homeless women that week in September.

This is a ministry that fills the most basic needs for some of our most vulnerable sisters and families that have no place to live and very few options. It is also a ministry that calls for lots of hands on participation from us here at BACC. We will need volunteers to spend the night at church with our guests each evening and serve breakfast (there will also be a CARITAS staff person here as well). We need people to provide breakfast foods and bag lunches, people to cook and serve dinner. We need people to do laundry and transport guests to showers. We will need a Lead Volunteer each evening. It takes a village to host CARITAS!
