

Have you ever noticed all the windows at Bon Air Christian Church? We have three stained glass windows in our sanctuary that are a wonderful part of our historic house of worship. We also have several clear glass windows, complete with shutters, to help adjust the amount of sunlight as we worship. The hallway leading down to the Education Wing is bright and airy with all the windows looking out at Bon Air. And in our Fellowship Hall we have lovely touches of stained glass and an inspirational round window above the kitchen door.

The church's windows are a good symbol for how BACC relates to the community. The community can look in through the windows and see a vibrant place of worship, people sharing in fellowship and service. Those inside the church can see the community around us needing the Good News of God's love.

This year's Stewardship Campaign is based on **Windows of Opportunity to Serve God**. The proposed budget was mailed out to the congregation the week of September 9. 

What is a Priscilla? Or a Timothy?

Amy Spangler Dunning is our "Priscilla aka Timothy". Priscilla was the name of the woman who welcomed Paul into her home when he visited Corinth. Timothy was an energetic young man who sought to follow in Paul's footsteps in sharing the gospel. When a person enters ministry, he or she has been called a Timothy or a Priscilla. Bon Air Christian Church had the good pleasure of nurturing Amy in her faith journey. She went on to seminary at Lexington Theological Seminary where she earned her Master of Divinity. Bon Air Christian Church and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Virginia ordained Amy as a Disciples of Christ minister.

Amy served churches in Kentucky and Iowa prior to earning her Master degree in Mental Health Counseling from Drake University. She presently provides mental health care through "Counseling Connections" in Lynchburg.

Amy said: "My approach to therapy is rooted in a belief in the inherent worth and dignity of all people and that, though we struggle in different ways, we each have within us the capacity for healing. It's just that, sometimes, we need someone to walk alongside us to get us there. Areas of focus for me are: early childhood trauma, depression, and anxiety. I am trained in the Gottman method of Couple's therapy and work with couples struggling to experience the positive aspects of committed life together. Additional trainings include, EMDR Level 1 & 2 (working toward certification), Janina Fisher's model for working with trauma (Levels 1,2,3), and have some experience in Internal Family Systems and Pat Ogden's body based trauma model."

Bill is excited to meet our wonderful congregation!






Women and Men's Fellowship Groups
