Thank you so much for the blood drive. We had a great day and saw 27 donors and collected 25 units. Those units can help as many as 75 patients! This is a huge help during this time.




#### A WORD FROM OUR FRIEND CHARLES

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. *Matthew 5:6* These words from Jesus are part of His teaching discourse known as the Sermon on the Mount. The general population in Jesus' day were hard working people - fishermen, farmers, laborers. They were not well-to-do. They knew what it was like to be hungry and thirsty, and to crave something good to eat or drink. Hunger and thirst were very real conditions for these people. The Judaism of Jesus' time was based on salvation by works. Throughout His ministry Jesus stressed salvation based on faith, faith in Himself as coming from God, and in God as the ultimate authority over all creation. Righteousness for Jesus' hearers involved remembering and understanding the scriptures. Children of young age were taught the words of the prophets and the stories of the heroes. The people of Jesus' time were much more familiar with their scriptures than many of us today are familiar with our Bible. Today's secular attractions and temptations are often seen to overcome and overwhelm our expressions of faith in Jesus and God, and of our devotion to His gracious Word. For our own spiritual good, we must not let this happen. We worship most what we have the most faith in. We must be certain our primary faith is in the God who created us, and who sustains us. Regular church attendance and personal Bible study reinforce in our minds the many examples of wisdom and divine instruction that are found in both Testaments. If we hunger and thirst for this righteousness, and seek it for ourselves, we will be filled.
