





#### WORDS FROM OUR FRIEND CHARLES STEVENS

Luke 2:8 Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9 And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. 10 Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. 11 For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger." 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 14 "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

Christmas. A time for family, friends, fellowship, and good wishes. How did it all get started? Luke tells us, in simple terms, the answer to that question. It had been 400 years since a prophet of the Lord had been sent to Israel. The people longed for some word from God, some good news to help them deal with, or even overthrow, the oppressive Roman occupation. Suddenly, to some shepherds, the bottom of the social ladder, came this good news. A angel from heaven announced the arrival of the very savior the people longed for. Very often, when God, or even His word, is presented to people, they immediately are afraid. But the angel told the shepherds not to be afraid. He was not bringing threats, but "good tidings of great joy...to all people." This good news was first presented to these shepherds and their flock, but the angel himself proclaimed that it was intended for ALL people. The Jews, the gentiles (that's everybody else), all the people who are rich, poor, any skin color, any spiritual inclination, sinners, business people, religious leaders, the hopeful and the despondent – ALL can benefit from this good news. And if this was not enough, a great multitude of heavenly angels greatly emphasized the first angel's good news, by proclaiming to the shepherds "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" The shepherds were not hallucinating. What they saw and heard was very real, very great news from God, and then that news was emphasized by many heavenly messengers. The shepherds immediately went to Bethlehem to investigate, to see, and to learn about what the angels had proclaimed to them. We should do likewise. We also have received this good news from God. We also should investigate, and as the shepherds did on their return to their flock, "make widely known" what the angels had said, that others also may "marvel" at the good news. If all people would accept, believe, and widely proclaim this good news straight from heaven, the family times, friends, fellowship, and good wishes we have at Christmas would be with us, world wide, at all times, not just at Christmas. And we would have our "peace on earth, and goodwill toward (all) men!" "Glory to God in the highest" for this good news.


