


Dear friends:




A Note from Barbara Regarding Help for Redd Elementary:

Welcome to VBS 2020! We have had to make some necessary changes in our traditional format, of course, to protect the health of our participants and volunteers:

- VBS will take place on-site from 8:30 10:30 a.m., Monday Friday, with a nightly Zoom meeting for wrap-up and story time at home. We will have a maximum of 30 participants, with no more than a total of 50 people in the building. Students will be in 6 groups of 5, with 2 teachers per group.
- We will have temp checks at the door each morning for everyone, and masks required for kids and adults (BACC to provide if needed).
- There will be sanitizing stations throughout our building.
- We will implement social distancing at rotations, and outdoors as much as possible.
- There will be pre-packaged art activities, to limit sharing of supplies.
- No lunch will be provided, though we will send kids home with pre-packaged snacks. Still feeling uncertain? Opt to pick up your art activities beforehand to do at home each day, then join us for our evening Zoom VBS! That will include story time and a science activity. We've got something for everyone at BACC!


