The 7:00 p.m. service is live and will include congregational singing.



Wreaths are a popular sight during the holiday season, and, along with Christmas trees, Nativity sets, Santa Claus props and colored lights, they bring a sense of cheer and warmth to homes and communities. From lights to bows, the features of wreaths each have specific religious meanings. Per HolidayInsights.com, the wreath's real or artificial evergreen branches represent growth and the promise of eternal life symbolized by Jesus Christ. They also help religious believers remember his everlasting love. Similarly, the wreath's circular shape—with no visible beginning or end also signifies the eternal nature and love of Christianity's idea of God. Holly symbolizes Jesus' crucifixion. The thorny branches represent his crown of thorns, while the red berries remind Christians of the blood shed for their sins. As with Christmas tree lights, those on a wreath—whether candles or electric bulbs—signify that Christ is the light of the world for



If you would like to help, please contact Cindy and she will share with you opportunities for service.




#### **WELCOME, GREG SHANNON!**
