#### On a Mission

As I write this, our youth group has just returned from their South Carolina mission trip. Their work has included serving on a memory care unit, volunteering at a car wash to raise money for Alzheimer's research, and doing some good ol' weeding in the hot South Carolina sun. We have been praying for them – for safe travels, and also that through this experience God would shape their lives and the lives of those they serve with in special ways.

What does it mean to be on a mission? Bon Air Christian Church defines its mission as reaching out to proclaim the gospel, reaching up to worship God, and reaching in to nurture and grow in faith and love. As we reach out, reach up, and reach in, we are in turn participating in God's mission in the world, the work of healing and wholeness.

Theologian David Bosch writes, in his book *Transforming Mission*, of the surprising nature of Christ's mission in the world: "What amazes one again and again is the *inclusiveness* of Jesus' mission. It embraces both the poor and the rich, both the oppressed and the oppressor, both the sinners and the devout. His mission is one of dissolving alienation and breaking down walls of hostility, of crossing boundaries between individuals and groups."

This mission to which we are called is beautiful and amazing, scary and surprising. As our youth are discovering this week, and as we discover anew every week, participating in God's mission puts us in relationship with all sorts of people and places we might never have expected – because the work of Christ, like the grace of Christ, embraces the whole world. Today, I am thanking God – for our youth who were willing to embark on this week of service; for the congregation that nurtures them; and for the call to this all-inclusive mission which God to gives each and every one of us.



They could also become agitated and anxious, but most of our friends were very friendly and loving, and very excited to see us each morning! Our youth learned how to communcate beyond speaking and it was beautiful to watch!

We ran the activity lessons and crafts for the day, we served lunches, cleaned out flower beds, threw a luau party, and visited with the residents and got to know each of them and their stories. It was a time we will likely never forget. These friends left imprints on our hearts!

Our "home base" for the week was Ridge Baptist Church in Summerville, SC where seven other Youth Groups were staying as well. We had worship and devotions each morning and night, and we had one free afternoon where we headed to the beach! 




#### **CHRISTIAN MEN'S FELLOWSHIP**


