Mental Health: Let's Talk About It!

Since 1949, May has been observed as Mental Health Awareness Month in the United States. During this month, a coalition of organizations and mental health advocates work to end the stigma that surrounds mental health challenges and negatively impacts the millions of Americans who struggle with such conditions as depression, schizophrenia, and bipolar disorder.

What might we do during this month to end stigma about mental health challenges in our communities?

I believe that the church can be a place of support and love for those who struggle with mental health challenges. It's also the case that churches have at times themselves been places of stigma and silencing, which makes it all the more important for faith communities to stand up and speak out on this topic.

In order to do this, we have to be the kind of community where difficult conversations can happen, and where people can share experiences that might be difficult to speak about. It is also important that we become mindful of the way that we use language related to mental health, and the ways in which certain commonly used phrases actually contribute to the stigma faced by people for whom mental health challenges are a part of everyday life.

I was excited to learn, when I first began speaking to people at Bon Air Christian Church, that this congregation has identified mental health and wholeness as a ministry focus. I look forward to leaning into that focus this month and in the months to come. This is a topic I'm passionate about for many reasons, from my own family history and personal experiences with mental health challenges as well as from witnessing how powerful it can be when congregations intentionally create space for difficult conversations.

If this is a conversation in which you would like to be involved, I hope you will let me know. So, this May, let's talk about it!


Good Eggs All Around!

Want to make a donation but not sure what to give? Here are some things that our beloved church camp could use to make Craig Springs even better for campers, counselors, and guests! Thank you for your generosity!

Touch-Free Soap & Touch- Free Paper Towel Dispensers

Having dispensers in the bathrooms will cut down on plastic waste, streamline our cleaning, and keep our guests' hands squeaky clean. Ryan (camp manager) has a relationship with the cleaning supply company, so contact him if you are interested in making this donation.

iPad and Laptop

Nurses are doing daily temperature checks and health screenings for campers and charting these things on a new medical record software, CampDoc. An iPad to take around with them would help ensure the wellness of campers and volunteers.

Dump Trailer

Craig Springs is dependent on outside contractors to deliver large amounts of gravel, mulch, and more to the camp. A dump trailer would allow us to transport these materials ourselves, which is used a lot, and would save money in the long run.

DSLR Camera

A good quality camera can capture memories and help us advertise the Craig Springs experience. New or used—we'd be happy with either!

Artificial Turf for Minigolf Course

The putt-putt course at the Clubhouse is a beloved tribute to the days when Craig Springs had its own golf course. Help us give it the refresh it needs with some new turf.

CARITAS SERVICE PROJECT MAY 23–JUNE 5, 2022

BACC has supported the work of CARITAS for over 20 years, and we have a wonderful opportunity to do so this spring! The needs remain high and have increased over the past couple of years. One CARITAS program is the Furniture Bank, where donations of household items and furniture help families furnish and equip their new homes. This includes homeless families and individuals, as well as refugees. Families, with their caseworkers, come to the Furniture Bank to choose needed items for their new homes. As a congregation, we will be collecting household items, as listed below, to supply the Furniture Bank and help those in great need. Please review the list of items below to be collected at the church from May 23 through June 5. Donated items will then be sorted and delivered to CARITAS. All items should be clean and in good condition/good working order. Household decorative items are not accepted.



ITEMS TO BE COLLECTED for CARITAS: HOUSEWARES



- Kitchen essentials, such as bakeware, dishes, glassware (no stemware), flatware, cooking utensils, pots/pans of any size, kitchen knives, and cutting boards
- Bed and Bath essentials, including bed sheets (any size), mattress pads, blankets, comforters (all sizes), pillows, towels (bath and kitchen), and laundry baskets/bags
- Small Appliances, such as toasters, microwave ovens, crockpots, coffee makers, blenders, food processors, mixers, fans (box and floor), small electric heaters, lamps (table and floor), DVD players, irons & ironing boards, clocks, and radios

FURNITURE

- Metal bed frames, bookcases, chairs (kitchen and upholstered), dressers, mattresses and box springs (stain and rip free, no foam mattresses), sofas, loveseats, ottomans (no sleeper sofas or sectionals), tables (kitchen/dining, night/end/coffee/TV stands), and mirrors
- **Furniture that cannot be accepted:** entertainment centers, head/foot boards, foam and king size mattresses, commercial office furniture, major appliances, specialty appliances (such as electric griddles, rice cookers).
- Because CARITAS is re-organizing the Furniture Bank this spring, we will be handling furniture donations differently. Please call the church office or Cathy Law (804-512-9092) if you have furniture to donate. We will not be taking furniture donations until the fall.

New items can be donated as well. If you'd like to make a monetary donation, please designate it for CARITAS Drive. **THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY** as we help others!
