



Thoughts on Stewardship

God's Abundance Stewardship Campaign for 2023

The past year has been one of renewal and reinvigoration for Bon Air Christian Church. As a faith community we have emerged from the pandemic wilderness with an expanded understanding of how to be the Body of Christ in a range of circumstances.

Many may be familiar with the fable of Stone Soup. A stranger comes to a village suffering from scarcity and encourages the sharing of limited resources to create abundance for all. In a similar manner, by sharing our faith, our gifts, and our resources we create God's abundance.

The Scriptures are full of examples of faith creating abundance. God provides manna and quail to the hungry Hebrew people after they fled from Egypt. Elijah instructs the Widow of Zarepath and her flour and oil feed her and her family as well as Elijah until the rains return. Elisha helps a widow save her sons from servitude by collecting and selling cooking oil. Christ's first miracle is turning scarcity into plenty by changing water into wine at a wedding. All of the Gospels recount Christ using limited resources to feed the hungry crowds. Abundance is created through faith and sharing our resources.

Our church doors are open to the community, and once again BACC is bustling with activity. A range of community groups gather within our walls, Bible School reached about 40 children to let them know about God's love for them, three worship services (including a Zoom option for those who cannot physically be present) and Sunday School take place each week, our Christian Women's Fellowship, Christian Men's Fellowship, and church committees meet regularly, and our building is a hub for things like health kits and CARITAS collections. Our physical presence in the community has purpose and meaning.

Our spiritual presence is even more important. Worship services nurture our relationship with God and help us spread the Good News. We reach out to comfort and care for the sick, grieving, and lonely among us. We work in partnership with other organizations to support critical missions too large for any one church to accomplish. All of these things are done through the abundance that comes through faith and sharing our time, talents, and resources.

While 2022 has been a year of renewal, 2023 will bring new opportunities for us to grow as a congregation and explore new ways to serve God and our sisters and brothers. The world around us poses many challenges as we move into 2023. If we are to continue to reach out to proclaim the Gospel, reach up to worship God and reach in to nurture and grow in faith and love, then we must continue to work together in faith. Now more than ever we need to work together sharing our faith and our gifts to create abundance to serve God. Please prayerfully consider how you can help create the abundance to support BACC's ministries in 2023.




QIGONG IS BACK! JOIN US FOR THESE MARVELOUS MONDAYS!




