What's Happening

General Assembly 2023

When the General Assembly meets in **Louisville, Kentucky July 29-August 1, 2023**, it will be the first time in four years the church as a whole has gathered in person. The theme for the 2023 General Assembly is "Kindom of God Within Us, Among Us." The theme is based on three scriptures: Luke 17:20-21, Genesis 11:1-9, and 2 Peter 1:3.

The planning committee described the theme, "There are multiple words, scriptures, languages, and ways to share and shape our common life. The church has more than one story to tell, and more than one tool for innovation and distinctive witness in the future. God is with us. What is life before God like? Salt, an open table, zoom, and treasure in clay jars. What have Disciples learned about life before God in the midst of the uncertainty the church and its members faced over the last three years?"

The theme "Kindom of God Within Us, Among Us" is a call for Disciples to strengthen their relationship to God both individually and communally through an expansive inperson and digital gathering of the church in Louisville. The past two years, local congregations and the wider church have needed to be separated but have also innovated new ways for God's limitless love to be revealed in our church, our communities and around the world. God's limitless imagination holds so many possibilities for the church.

This four-day event will encourage Disciples to gather online and in-person to celebrate the way that God's expansive love connects each of us as "kin" and to part of the larger kindom of God. Save the date and join the church July 29-August 1, 2023 for worship, workshops, Bible study, opportunities to explore Louisville, mission, and the sacred work of the church.

Dear Friends,

On behalf of the Virginia Institute of Pastoral Care's Board of Directors and counseling staff, thank you for your contribution of \$225.00. The support of your congregation for our Counselling Aid Fund ensures that clients seeking pastoral counseling will receive services regardless of their ability to pay. In 2021, VIPCare served more than 1,750 clients through 6,160 counseling sessions with 1,871, or 34% of, sessions underwritten by the Counseling Aid Fund. In total, VIPCare provided \$300,229 in sliding scale counseling services to clients in need. I expect the 2022 totals will be similar.

Bon Air Christian Church's gift ensures that VIPCare is able to continue to offer this level of financial assistance, so no one is turned away from counseling because of an inability to cover the cost of their care. 
