

A legend among Virginia football referees, 99-year-old Ray Beasley draws a flag – the Gold Flag Award!



In nearly 40 years of football officiating,
Ray Beasley (left) earned a reputation
as a top-flight rules expert who "didn't
take any foolishness." For decades, he
worked at C&P Telephone and refereed
alongside friend Dick Goodman Sr.
(right). Both men played football for
Virginia Tech after returning from military
service during World War II.



Ray Beasley, 99, of Midlothian began officiating high school football games in the Richmond area in 1950. During his high school football career, he played as a running back for John Marshall High School, which won the state championship in 1940, capping a season where the team was undefeated and unscored-on.
