"When we do something new, let's talk about what we'll do!" - Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood

In the Finnegan-Hosey household, we are currently big fans of *Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood*. The animated show is based on the classic work of the Reverend Fred Rogers, better known, of course, as Mister Rogers. The "When We Do Something New" song, a staple of the show, is sung whenever the characters are nervous or excited about a new experience. The song teaches children - not to mention us anxious adults! - that it's ok to share your nerves, and that talking through a new thing helps make "new" seem less unnerving.

This summer, we are going to try a few new things at Bon Air Christian Church - specifically, a **new summer worship schedule**, **with a combined Sunday service at 10 a.m. and our Saturday casual service at 5 p.m**. The first Saturday/Sunday of this new schedule will be **May 27/28**, and **September 2/3** will be the last weekend for it before we return to our regular schedule in the fall. Our Fellowship Sunday School class will continue to meet over the summer, at 9am. We're excited about this experiment - and it's just that, an experiment that we can try out, see how it goes, and then talk about it!

A different summer schedule isn't the only new experience we're talking about this month, though. On Pentecost Sunday (May 28th), we remember the new beginning of the earliest church. In the words of a video from our wider church's New Church Ministry, "In the beginning, every church was new. God was doing a new thing, creating a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world." Pentecost isn't just a remembrance of something that happened a long time ago; it's a reminder that the Holy Spirit is still among us, calling us to share God's love in ever-new ways.

I am so grateful that the Holy Spirit continues to blow fresh winds of inspiration and growth here at Bon Air Christian Church. Keep an eye out this month for all of ways the Spirit is calling us into mission and ministry. And when that call leads us to consider doing something new, well, let's talk about what we'll do.

Triple 1 and Triple 2 Camps offer the traditional church camp experience. Open to campers who have completed 3rd through 12th grade.



General Assembly 2023

When the General Assembly meets in **Louisville, Kentucky July 29-August 1, 2023**, it will be the first time in four years the church as a whole has gathered in person. The theme for the 2023 General Assembly is "Kindom of God Within Us, Among Us." The theme is based on three scriptures: Luke 17:20-21, Genesis 11:1-9, and 2 Peter 1:3.

This four-day event will encourage Disciples to gather online and in-person to celebrate the way that God's expansive love connects each of us as "kin" and to part of the larger kindom of God. Save the date and join the church July 29-August 1, 2023 for worship, workshops, Bible study, opportunities to explore Louisville, mission, and the sacred work of the church.

Our congregation is entitled to FIVE voting representatives at the General Assembly.





Dear BACC Friends,
