#### **Telling the Whole Story**

September is here, with all that comes with it here at Bon Air Christian Church! Starting on September 10th, we'll be back to our two Sunday services, with the choir singing at the late service and all of our Sunday School classes meeting at the 10 a.m. hour. We'll celebrate our fall kickoff with a potluck brunch on September 10th and a community fun day on September 16th. We'll have our friends from NAMI of Central Virginia back for a presentation for our JOY Group on Mental Health for Seniors. There is *a lot* going on at BACC!

And also: we remember that in the swirl of activities and ministries, at our core we are about sharing in the story of God's gracious work in the world. ## Sunday School



This new generation could more aptly be described as 'Reliable One-of-a-Kind Men Enjoying Ourselves'.

The once-a-month Men's Gathering is scheduled for **September 21st at 5:30 PM**. Location is Extra Billy's Brewery and Smokehouse, 1110 Alverser Drive, Midlothian, VA 23113. The Men's Gathering is held at a different restaurant each month on the third Thursday of the month. Usual attendance is 7 - 16 hungry men.

#### **Did You Know?**

BACC now has an in-house AED unit located in the Fellowship Hall near the double doors leading to the sanctuary. An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet <u>easy-to-use</u>, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

#### There's More to Our Story...

In late 2022 we said a loving God Speed, but not good-bye, to Cindy Stratton, our minister for over 30 years. We then said an equally loving Welcome to David Finnegan-Hosey as our full-time minister after he and Cindy served as co-pastors the previous year. 2023 has been a year full of vibrant service to our congregation and the surrounding community -- but there's more to our story.

The Holy Spirit is moving here at Bon Air Christian Church. So far in 2023 we have welcomed 10 new members to our congregation. We joyfully dedicated five little ones into our church family. We hosted 63 children for Vacation Bible School. We sent 19 kids, and five counselors to camp at Craig Springs. We have revived our mission focus on wholeness ministry. We've reached out to the community to educate about mental wellness. We hosted health screenings and blood drives to bolster the physical well-being of our neighbors. We have engaged in spiritual growth through three book studies with another one coming up for Advent. We regularly open our doors to AA, quilters, the Bon Air Historical Society, and other community groups. We continue to support CARITAS and the Bainbridge Food Pantry. Very recently we had the opportunity to help those struggling in the aftermath of devastating wildfires in Maui through Week of Compassion. Our congregation has been busy and productive -- but there is more to our story.

As we look ahead to 2024, we know there is more that we can do. We want to continue caring for our congregation from those recently dedicated babies to our youth, families, and seniors. We want to persist in our focus on wholeness and mental wellness. We want to seek new ways of engaging with the surrounding community.

As we begin our annual budget and planning process, we know there is more to our story. It's not just about the activities we engage in, it's also the spiritual growth that isn't really visible – it's within us as individuals and as a community of faith. We hope our story can grow and expand in 2024. We hope there are more ways to serve one another and our sisters and brothers around us. We hope there are even more opportunities to grow spiritually. As we prepare for 2024 and the ways our church can share the Good News, please think about what more our story can be.

Board Members: Please plan to attend as we will need a quorum.




#### **Reconciliation Special Offering 2023:**
