As the New Year begins, what are you searching for?

As you have probably heard, Bon Air Christian Church is entering into a process of searching, specifically for an associate minister to help us strengthen our ministries across the multiple generations that make up our beautiful congregation. As we embark on this path together, we will be looking for ways to hear from you about what you are looking for and hoping for in an associate.

One way to do that is to start by thinking about what each of us is hoping for and searching for this year. As the year begins, we'll asking that question together in our worship services. We'll take a look at biblical stories of searching, like Magi coming from a faraway land in search of a vision. Or people coming to John the Baptist at the Jordan River looking for a new beginning. Or crowds coming to Jesus seeking blessings, healing, and transformation. Along with these stories, we'll be offering some creative and interactive ways to share with each other our hopes and imaginings for this coming year.

Of course, as disciples of Christ, when someone asks us what we're searching for our first answer might be easy: "Jesus!" I'm reminded of the old story of a pastor sitting on the steps of the sanctuary for a Children's Sermon, and beginning his message by asking them: "Can you tell me an animal that's gray and hides nuts for the winter?" After a long silence one of the children responded: "Well, pastor, I know the right answer is Jesus, but that sure sounds like a squirrel!"

Reading the ancient stories of Jesus reminds us that often, people are searching for something else, and are surprised to find Jesus, or surprised by the version of their searching that Jesus fulfills. Perhaps you are searching for something right now, or perhaps you know a friend, family member, or neighbor who is searching. I pray that this season helps encourage us all in our searching – and that we find ourselves, like the disciples so many centuries ago, surprised by what Christ has in store for us. Surprised that it is God who has first been reaching out to us.


