Hello David and Bon Air Christian Church,

Thank you for donating towards the shipping costs of your Cleanup Buckets. Your donation helps us get your kits to their final destination. Through your generosity, dignity is being restored, and lives are being changed.

Attached, you'll find our 2023 and 2024 mid-year Shipping Reports, you are making a difference in the lives of individuals affected by <u>Hurricanes</u>. As of October 18th, CWS has distributed 5,824 Emergency Cleanup Buckets, 10,310 Hygiene Kits, 7,280 Blankets, 1,800 Menstrual Hygiene Kits, 650 School Kits and 72 Welcome Backpacks to partners in Florida and North Carolina (a value of more than \$697,000). We are shipping more supplies as impacted communities become accessible. CWS will also be involved in long-term recovery to help meet the needs of those impacted in the months and years to come.

We hope this report and story help convey the impact and importance of the CWS Kits program.

2024 Minister's Report

Below you will find the Minister's Report to BACC's Annual Congregational Meeting, held on Nov 3, 2024:

Here at Bon Air Christian Church, we're on a mission! By the grace of God, we've lived into that mission over the past year. Together in the Spirit of Christ, we have:

Reached out to proclaim the gospel

We have connected with our neighbors to meet needs and share God's love through ministries new (like Community Fun Day, Parents Night Out, Intergenerational Mission Trip, and Help Build Hope house framing project) and familiar (like Vacation Bible School and the largest Trunk or Treat we've ever hosted). Our mission focus on human wholeness and mental wellness continues to bear fruit, with YouTube "Mental Wellness Moments," a new NAMI Family Support Group meeting in our building, several members taking a Mental Health First Aid training, and a newly offered yoga class, along with deepening our long-standing partnerships with NAMI of Central Virginia and AA. NAMI and AA members helped contribute to our response to Hurricanes Helene and Milton. We served as a collection site for emergency cleanup buckets, sending 114 buckets to NC to assist with recovery efforts. Our annual CROP Walk raised thousands of dollars as we spent a beautiful afternoon walking through our community (and of course keeping the Golden Sneaker!). Coming up, another Parents Night Out (November 23rd) and a January sermon series (more on that later) will provide more chances to reach out, share God's love, and live out our mission in God's world.

Reached up to worship God

Our worship is Spirit-filled and vibrant, connecting with long-time members and newcomers alike. Sermon series – on themes such as Searching, the Holy Spirit, the Lord's Prayer, Gathered at the Table, and Intergenerational Stories – help us deepen our understanding of scriptural themes and their relevance for us as disciples today. So far this year, our worship services have welcomed an average of ~120 in-person (14 on Saturdays, 29 at early service, 77 at late service, with an average of 88 in our combined summer Sunday service) and ~20 via Zoom each week, with our worship videos on YouTube averaging around 40 views. We have celebrated the baptisms of Sara, Nick, and Catherine; the dedications of Tillie, Brynn, and Natalie; and we've welcomed Ethan, Mackenzie, and Carol into membership.

Reached in to nurture and grow in faith and love

Advent and Lent devotionals lovingly written by members and delivered to those who have a hard time getting to the church building. Meals made and delivered. Pastoral visitation – by my count, 82 in-person pastoral care conversations so far this year, including hospitals and hospices, homes and offices, coffee shops and care facilities, premarital prep and personal crises, and more texts and phone calls than I can really keep count of. Our Youth Group meets the first Sunday of every month for faith, fellowship, and fun. Our Zoom prayer and fellowship group continues to meet on Wednesday evenings. A summer book study invited participants' to journey deeper in our faith, with a focus on the Disciples' origins as a mission-driven movement re-focusing on mission today. Of course, we've also said farewell to beloved members of our church community, some of whom have moved on to different places or different congregations, and some – Jim Henderson and Lois Zarefoss – who have gone on into memory eternal, joining the great cloud of witnesses who keep us mindful that nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord.

It's my blessing to serve a church on a mission. I thank God for each of you!
