#### **Thanksgiving and Christmas Families**

Thanksgiving donations will be due by November 17th Christmas gifts (unwrapped) will be due by December 3rd

This year, we are sponsoring several families, with a total of 20-22 children. There are multiple ways everyone can participate, to brighten the lives of others during the holiday season. For Thanksgiving, the families will receive a box of canned/dry goods and a gift certificate for perishable foods (eg., turkey, fresh produce, dairy). For Christmas, the children in the families will receive gifts of clothing, a toy or two and a book. The families will receive a gift card for Christmas dinner food.

#### Ways to participate/help:

- -Donate dry goods for Thanksgiving meals (e.g, canned vegetables and fruit, potato mixes, rice, dessert and breakfast mixes). Boxes will be in the hallways outside the Fellowship Hall and the church office
- -Donate money for the gift cards (designate your donation for Thanksgiving and/or Christmas)
- -Sponsor gifts for the children. Each child will receive an outfit, a toy or two and a book. Gifts for the parents will be household paper items or cleaning supplies. The link for the online sign-up form will be in the Wednesday emails starting November 13. For those who prefer, there will be trees, in the Fellowship Hallway, with ornament tags for gifts, starting November 17. All gifts are to be returned to the church by December 8. Collection boxes for gifts will be in the same places as the Thanksgiving food boxes.

#### Timeline for our holiday giving:

- \*November 3-17: donations of dry goods for Thanksgiving meals, and/or monetary gifts for Thanksgiving grocery gift cards
- \*November 13-December 8: Selecting and purchasing Christmas gifts for children and parents; and/or monetary donations for Christmas dinner gift cards. All gifts must be returned by December 8.

#### **CHRISTIAN WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP**



#### **HURRICANE HELENE UPDATES**

The pictures of the devastation after Hurricane Helene have been hard to comprehend, and the recovery will take years. To help those in need, Bon Air Christian Church served as a collection site for Church World Services Emergency Clean-Up buckets. BACC provided 38 buckets, with a total of 114 collected, with donations from at least 9 other churches and organizations. The buckets have been delivered to Hillyer Christian Church (DOC) in Raleigh, and will soon be taken to western NC, as they continue sorting through the damage.

Many thanks to all who have donated to CWS and Week of Compassion for hurricane recovery. Both CWS and WOC will be supporting recovery efforts in the months and years ahead. BACC members have donated over \$3800.00 for this work, in addition to the Clean-Up buckets assembled.

Christmount, the national conference center for the Disciples of Christ, in Black Mountain, NC, sustained major damage to their water system, roads and grounds. After four weeks, their water system is again operational and most of their roads have re-opened, but there is still much work

to do. Their Facebook page has regular updates.

Thank you for Bon Air Christian Church's recent gift of \$927.50 to Richmond Metro Habitat for Humanity, received on September 20, 2024.

Your support enables families like Melissa to provide a safe and healthy home for her children. The mother of three works full-time in customer service for a mobile telecommunications company while she pursues an associate degree in applied science from J. Sargeant Reynolds. The home that she was sharing with her daughter and two sons was built in 1930 and needs renovation. The windows are drafty, and the house is cold and the winter.

"Owning a home will mean that I am able to give my kids everything they need," Melissa told Richmond Habitat. She has now completed 10 financial and homeownership education classes and monthly one-on-one budgeting sessions to make sure she is equipped with information that will help her succeed as a homeowner.

Melissa also completed 350 hours of volunteer time — helping to build her own home, other Habitat homes, or by working at our ReStore. After finishing these program requirements, Melissa was recently able to purchase a safe, secure, energy, efficient home and pay an affordable, 0% interest mortgage, making her dream of homeownership reality.
