A disaster like this can stir up many questions for us. "How can we help?" is an obvious place to start. Our partners at Week of Compassion urge us, in the days immediately following a disaster, to "Stay - Pray - Give." (A giving envelope is open for online giving, or a check can be made out to the church with "Week of Compassion" in the memo line). As time goes on, opportunities will arise for volunteers to help rebuild in affected areas, but it's too soon for now. We begin with prayers and generosity.

We might also find ourselves with questions such as "Why does God allow such things to happen?" It's ok to have these questions. Our scriptures are full of faithful people asking hard questions of God. A quick scan through the Psalms, that great prayerbook at the center of our Bibles, will offer many examples. There's much more that can be said on this topic, but just remember that when he was asked to summarize the scriptures, Jesus responded: "Love God with your whole self, and love your neighbor as your self." Let our responses to tragedy be guided by this love. Narratives, whether theological or secular, that blame those most impacted by disaster are unhelpful and unnecessary.

Starting with love doesn't answer all our questions. There are many things that happen that are beyond our ability - certainly beyond my ability - to understand. But our scriptures suggest that stewardship of God's creation and our relationships with each other have real impact, including in the natural world. We are called to ongoing compassion and care: for each other, for the world we live in, and also for ourselves as we respond to hard things. On that last point, it sometimes is time to turn off the news or social media feeds, to step back from something that feels overwhelming, and to take a deep breath, a prayerful walk, or a small act of compassion and kindness. Right now, I think I'll do just that. I hope you will, too.

## Help Build Hope

#### **House Framing Update**

What a glorious day it was on September 7th! Our front parking lot was filled with joy and love, as we worked together to build the framing for a family's new home. With 112 people present, we completed 53 sections of framing in just 2 ½ hours! By noon, the framing sections were loaded on the trailer to go to Hillsville and we had eaten lunch. **Wow**! Thank you to all who helped build, prepare food, and keep us organized.

There were 13 faith communities represented that day, including 11 Disciple congregations: Bon Air, Gayton Rd., 1st Christian Hopewell, The Ministry Church, Seventh St., Perseverance, Springfield, Olive Branch and Slash Christian Churches. Bon Air Presbyterian, Gayton Baptist and the Islamic Center of Virginia were also represented. The house went to the Fuller Center for Housing-Greater Carroll County, VA, for a young couple with a 3 year old daughter and a second child on the way. The Fuller Center functions much like Habitat for Humanity. They held a building blitz the next week and got all the framing and the roof trusses installed in two days, then finished the roof, exterior siding, basic HVAC, plumbing and electrical and drywall within 5 days.

Thanks to the generosity of so many folks, monetary donations exceeded our expenses, and extra funds will be sent to the Fuller Center to help with the completion of the house.


#### **ALL SAINTS DAY**
