As I write this, it's about 95 degrees outside, which is making it hard for me to wrap my mind around a fall newsletter article. Summer isn't anywhere near ready to give up the ghost. Nevertheless, we are looking ahead to fall, a season that makes us think about change. Leaves change color. Kids - and teachers - head back to school. The weekend after Labor Day, our worship service times change - back to two services on Sunday and a 4pm Saturday service.

Bon Air Christian Church has gone through a lot of change over the past few years. Some beloved members have moved away; others have passed on into glory. New people have joined our fellowship, meaning that in some way, we are a different community, even as we are in continuity with the church we have always been. The challenges of covid led to new ways of being together online, which we have continued to find meaningful even as we have also restored and revived our in-person gatherings. A new co-ministry arrangement; then the retirement of a beloved minister; now a search for an associate minister; all requiring flexibility in figuring out how we are in ministry and mission together.

That's a lot of change, and change can be hard. But our scriptures do not promise us a life without change. What they do promise is that God is faithful; that God's love is steadfast; and that by the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus Christ is with us through all the seasons of our lives.

Will there be more change in the future? Most certainly! But we give thanks and praise for God's faithfulness, and we keep our hearts fixed on the truths that do not change: God is love. Christ is with us. The Holy Spirit gives us life.

Associate Minister Search Update

Thank you to everyone who came to the Meet & Greet on Sunday, August 18th for our candidate for the Associate Minister search. It was a wonderful display of the love and energy of our congregation! Please continue to keep the search process, your search committee, and our current candidate surrounded by your prayers.

What is an Associate Minister going to do?

We are searching for an Associate Minister for Intergenerational Ministries, who would focus on our programming ministries that reach people at different life stages within the church (such as Youth Group, JOY Group, and families with young children) as well as create ministry opportunities to connect people across generations (such as an intergenerational mission project). The Associate Minister would also assist in leading worship and in the broader ministries of the church.

What happens next?

The search committee has met and will bring a formal recommendation to the church board at their meeting on **September 15th**, after first consulting with the elders for any input. If the board votes to approve making an offer to Rev. Tracey Perry, then a called congregational meeting will be announced for discussion and voting on extending a call.

I missed the visit. How can I hear from the candidate?

If you missed Rev. Perry's visit and sermon, you can always watch it on our YouTube channel at Bon Air Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), where all of our sermons are posted.

I have some thoughts about the candidate. With whom should I share them?

If you have any questions or any feedback you'd like to share about Rev. Tracey Perry's visit, you can reach out to our Search Committee chairs, Diane Clark and Russ Johnson. Note also that Board meetings (such as our September 15th meeting) are open to all members of the church, and that all members of the church will be able to share thoughts, ask questions, and vote at a called congregational meeting if the process moves in that direction.


Sunday School

Suggestions for Leaders by Larissa Kwong Abazia

Water plays a central role in the stories of creation, the delivery of God's people (through the parting of the Red Sea and the crossing of the Jordan River), judgment of a people weak in faith, and the adoption of the people of God through baptism. Sometimes there is too much water and sometimes there is too little water. Consider the waters of chaos in Genesis and the River of Life in the last chapter of Revelation, where chaos is no more. This study explores some of the Bible's 800 references to water.

This group takes turns leading the study and bringing the salad greens. Everyone else brings something to add to the salad. You may have figured out why it's called the Salad CWF. Come at 6:00 for salad and fellowship. If you have trouble attending in person, this is a great group to join. Let Cathy Law know you are interested and she'll send you the Zoom link.
