


APRIL 13TH & 20TH

EARTH DAY 2025


With Earth Day this month, it's a time for each of us to renew our commitment to do what we can to take care of our planet Earth. Recycling is one way, and there are multiple ways to do that. In Virginia, each city and county is required to establish and maintain recycling programs. Most of us are familiar with how to recycle paper, glass and plastic, but there are also ways to recycle electronics (to keep them out of the dump, where hazardous metals may be released), old appliances and sheet metal. Here's a list of resources:

Computer/Electronics Recycling:

- Many electronics can be recycled on the 1st Saturday of the Month:

- Most computer companies are now required in Virginia to offer free recycling program. In addition, Best Buy and Staples also collect computers for recycling Cords can be recycled too.

Wreaths are a symbol of celebration, remembrance and decorations. The circular shape represents eternity.

Wreaths have existence since ancient times, starting as pieces of jewelry and adornment and worn as ornamental head pieces.

Decorative wreaths placed on your front door originated during Ancient Greece to promote healthy crops. A wreath would be made from the previous year's harvest such as wheat in the hope of a fruitful harvest in the coming year.



The Advent wreath was first made by Lutheran priest in the 16th century to educate children about the meaning and purpose of the advent season.

Today wreaths are used for a variety of reasons including in memorial to honor and show respect to fallen soldiers.

Wreaths have become a beloved tradition to embody the cycle of life, nature's resilience and a spirit of togetherness.
