"Wisdom goes here"

First, a bit of church office backstory: each month, Kendra puts together a draft of this newsletter for the church, leaving an open space for your Minister to write an opening message to you. Occasionally, she will put some text in as a placeholder for the title. This month, when I opened the file up to write my piece, I saw that she had labeled the opening letter "Wisdom goes here." Talk about a high bar.

I don't know if I have much wisdom to share this month, but luckily, to quote LeVar Burton on *Reading Rainbow*, you don't have to take my word for it. In the Book of Proverbs, we meet Lady Wisdom, a personification of God's Spirit and Word. Proverbs 8 tells us that "On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out."

Where does Wisdom go? She is portrayed as going to the places where people gather for conversation, discernment, and communal exchange. In a way, Wisdom goes everywhere there is life. There, she takes a stand and speaks up for those in need. She offers discernment and guidance. She brings creative power and life to the people who choose to listen to her.

As we celebrate Pentecost this month, it's worth remembering that Wisdom is one image for the Spirit of God that is poured out to call the Church into existence - the Church that is still sent out in mission to seek the places where Wisdom can be found.

I don't know if *I* have any wisdom to offer. But God offers us wisdom, and sends us out to the same places Lady Wisdom goes - all the places where people are in need of life, of consolation, and of community. Wisdom "goes there." And so shall we!
