### This Lent, We're On the Way with Jesus

The sacred season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5th). Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) leading up to Easter. Forty days reminds us of Jesus fasting in the wilderness, itself an echo of many other wilderness experiences throughout scripture.

This Lent, our theme will be "On the Way with Jesus." In Luke's gospel, ten chapters (from 9:51-19:27) are dedicated to Jesus's journey from the Galilee to Jerusalem. Ten chapters of travel from the familiar environs of home to an encounter with the powers and principalities that await Jesus and his disciples, an encounter which will lead to his death at the hands of religious and political authority. For ten chapters, we walk with Jesus on the way to the cross...and, finally, to the empty grave that lies beyond it.

For the next 40 days, we will be on the Way with Jesus. We'll learn that some of his more difficult teachings can only make sense if we are journeying alongside him, not only hearing his words but walking with him, meeting the people he meets, loving the people he loves.

At BACC, we have many opportunities to grow in our walk of faith throughout the Lenten season. I pray that we may we find each other on our way with Jesus throughout this sacred season.

## Preparing for Lent


During this sacred season of 40 days (not including Sundays) leading up to Holy Week and Easter, we have many different ways to grow in our faith:

Our Lent devotional guide is now available; you can pick one up in the sanctuary during worship, at the pancake supper, or in the church office. Many thanks to everyone who contributed!

Our 24-hour Ash Wednesday prayer vigil will begin at 6:00 a.m. on **March 5th**. Consider signing up if you haven't already. Our goal is to have someone praying for the entire 24 hours. We especially need people to sign up between the hours of 7 p.m. - midnight.

Throughout Lent, our worship focus will be "On the Way with Jesus," with the weekly gospel lessons coming from Luke's extended travel narrative as Jesus and the disciples journey from the Galilee to Jerusalem.

In keeping with that theme, our Lenten book study this year will be *The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life,* by Adam Hamilton. The study begins on **March 5th/6th**, with a Wednesday Zoom session beginning at 7:05 p.m. or a Thursday in-person session at 10:30 a.m. Books are available in the church office.

PANCAKE DINNER TUESDAY, 3/4 @ 6:00 PM




Donations will be collected --ALL are welcome! Shrove Tuesday or Pancake

## Sharing God's Love

### **OPPORTUNITIES TO SERVE**

At Bon Air Christian Church, there are multiple opportunities for us to reach out to others in our community, to show God's love at a time when it may be most needed. Here are some of those ways, both for local and global missions.

**Non-perishable food donations for the Bainbridge Food Pantry**. Canned fruit, jelly/jam, canned meats and hearty canned soups are most needed. Bins are located by the church office and the Fellowship hallway.

**Volunteer at Redd Elementary.** Read Across America is March 7, when volunteers sign up for an hour or more to read a book to classrooms. Watch the Wednesday email for sign-up info. Another opportunity will be Field Day on May 23, when volunteers help with outdoor games and activities. The sign-up for Field Day will come in a few weeks. Watch for it!

**HomeAgain Shelters:** For about 30 years, the BACC Elders and their flocks provided a meal once a month at the men's shelter. That shelter has closed, but the BACC Elders are looking at alternate ways for the flocks to support those experiencing homelessness. Watch for info in the next few weeks.

**Church World Services Kits:** BACC serves as a collection site for CWS hygiene, period and kids (previously school) kits and emergency clean-up buckets. If you would like to put together some kits, here is the link to the CWS site: <u>Assemble Kits - CWS Kits</u>. The kits' lists were recently updated, to better reflect the needs. They are a small but impactful way to bring relief to someone during a difficult time. Please deliver the boxed kits to the church by May 31.

**Virginia Regional Mission Trip:** In June, several BACC members are going to Christmount, in Black Mountain, NC, to help with Hurricane Helene recovery. Christmount is the national camp and conference center for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Our own Diane Clark is the co-director for the mission trip. While registrations are full, watch for updates about this trip.

**Special Offerings:** Over the course of the year, there are 6 special offerings collected to support various ministries in our denomination. In February, the offering was for Week of Compassion, the relief, refugee and development mission fund for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), which works with partners to alleviate suffering throughout the world. Donations for WOC are still accepted. The next special offering will be at Easter, which supports Disciples' ministries at the national and international level.

**The bulletin board in the back hallway** has information about mission work around the world. A volunteer is needed to keep the Week of Compassion map updated on its work around the world. Let the church office know if you could help.

- o Pets & creatures of any phylum.
- o Vehicles, craft or equipment that requires a personal property tax.
- o Firearms & ammunition. (Bows, crossbows, arrows, bolts, knives & similar items that can be sold without a background check and are in compliance with Virginia law are OK).
